December 7, 2014: King David Part 2



Have each person in the family say the best part of their week and the worst part of their week.



Psalm 51

Summary: When told about his sin, David tells God he is sorry and is going to change.



Do together:

Draw the outline of a tee shirt. Write "S I N" on the front of the shirt. Then with Liquid Paper, correction fluid or tape, or a white crayon, cover up the letters so that they can no longer be seen.

Think about:

Tell everyone about a time you spilled some food on your clothes or played outside and got them muddy. What did you have to do to get them clean? David wrote a song after he realized he had made a mistake with Bathsheba. He sort of compares his sin to dirt and to God's forgiveness as making him clean. When you tell God you are dirty (sorry that you have sinned) and ask him to wash you clean (forgive you) will he do it?

Also read: Psalm 32:5; 1 John 1:9
