Have each person in the family say the best part of their week and the worst part of their week.



Matthew 5; Mark 4; Luke 10, 15



Do together:

Have a treasure hunt! Hide some small objects – quarters or Hershey kisses, for instance – in another room or outside. Then start searching.

Think about:

The parables Jesus told the people had important meanings. What was Jesus trying to tell the people with his story about the one lost sheep? How do you feel to know that Jesus loves everyone – even those who are very bad and run from him – because he wants them to know him and believe in him? What was Jesus trying to tell the people with his story about the Samaritan who helped a man he didn't even know? Can you name some ways you can be a "good neighbor" to people? In one of his sermons, Jesus mentioned a lot of people who, at first, might seem to have it bad, but as it turns out, by doing the right thing, they were "blessed." What does it mean to be "blessed?"
