Dear Friends,

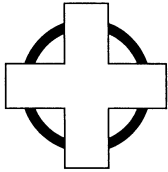

Planning Your Marriage Service

A marriage service is a worship service. The service includes Scripture reading(s), a sermon, the exchange of vows, blessings and prayer. A typical order of service is listed here to assist you. We will provide whatever guidance you need in making decisions about readings, music and other elements of the service. We can, for example, include additional blessings, such as those by or for parents or stepchildren, if you wish.

Preparing for Marriage

Marriage is a serious, lifelong commitment and we are so excited to be a part of this journey with you. In order to prepare you for your wedding day and your life together as a married couple, we highly recommend Premarital Counseling. Not only does this give you a discount on your marriage license; it also provides you with tools that will serve you well in this new stage of your life. This class is offered once a year at Our Savior's. If you cannot attend, we recommend the Premarital courses offered by Lutheran Social Services, Green Lake Lutheran Ministries, or Shetek Lutheran Ministries. Other options are available, but before you decide on any, talk with the pastor officiating your wedding to find the best option for you.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

A marriage service typically includes 2 or 3 readings from the Bible. The pastor can help you select readings if you wish, but there is no hard and fast rule about which lessons should be included in a marriage service.

Many couples have found passages emphasizing joy, love, thankfulness, faithfulness and commitment meaningful and appropriate. The following passages are examples of readings sometimes selected for marriage services:

VOWS

Here are some sample of vows. You may select any of these. If you prefer to write your own, please review them with the pastor at your last pre-marital session.

1. I, _____, take you _____ to be my wedded wife/husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish as long as God gives us life, and to you _____, I pledge my love.
2. I take you _____ to be my wife/husband, and these things I promise you. I will be faithful to you and honest with you; I will respect, trust, help and care for you; I will share my life with you. I will forgive you as we have been forgiven and I will try with you to better understand ourselves, the world and God; through the best and the worst of what is to come until death parts us.
3. _____, I want to live with you just as you are. I will be honest with you and forgive you, just as God has forgiven me. I love you for what you are to me and for what you are to others. With Christ as my guide, I will attempt to provide the

unconditional love needed for your health and growth. I choose you above all others, and promise to be faithful to you as long as life endures.

4. I take you, _____, to be my wife/husband, from this day forward. I promise before God and these witnesses to be your faithful husband/wife, to join with you and to share all that is to come, to give and to receive, to speak and to listen, to inspire and to respond, and in all circumstances of our life together, to be loyal to you with my whole life and all my being.
5. I _____, take you _____, to be my wife/husband, and in doing so, commit my life to you, encompassing all sorrows and joys, all hardships and triumphs, all experiences of life; a commitment made in love, kept in faith, lived in hope, and eternally made new.
6. In the name of God and with Christ as my witness, I _____ take you, _____ to be my wife/husband, to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, until we are parted by death. This is my solemn vow.

MUSIC

A wedding ceremony in a church is an act of worship. The music in worship points to God and invites God's blessing on the relationship. Within these guidelines there is great freedom. Your music may be instrumental and/or vocal and include pieces by a soloist, group and/or congregational hymn(s).

Our Savior's Director of Music Ministries, Shannon Stuckey (507-233-4434 or shannon@oursaviorsnewulm.org) will help you plan your marriage service music and/or discuss the use of the sound system. If you have questions about or would like help choosing the processional, recessional, hymns and or special music, she will guide you through the options available to you. Shannon can also help you find musicians if needed.

If you would like to have prerecorded music played, please have that ready to practice at the rehearsal. We can provide a headphone jack which can be plugged into a device such as a phone, mp3 player, or cd player (not provided). You will need to find someone to play the music and control the device during the service.

Wedding Service Details

Expectations

- The church does not assume responsibility for items left in dressing rooms, gifts, or other items brought to the church.
- Parties using the church are responsible for all damages.
- The church has 2 brass candelabra, which you may use. You will need to supply 14 10-inch candles. Candles may be lit informally by an usher prior to seating guests or immediately before the processional. Glass holders might need to be cleaned.
- Rice and birdseed are a serious safety hazard and custodial problem. We respectfully ask you not to use them.
- Please have formal photographs taken before your ceremony. We ask that there is no flash photography during the ceremony.
- Bulletins may be purchased and printed at stationery stores or print shops. They are the wedding couple's responsibility.
- If you are planning to use a guest book, please wait to get signatures until the reception.
- We ask that no alcohol be brought on the premises. Anyone under the influence of alcohol will be asked not to participate in the service.
- We are a smoke-free facility. We ask that no smoking be allowed on Church property.

Day of Your Wedding

- The church building will be open as needed on the day of the service.
- Please arrange the set-up details for flowers at the rehearsal on the previous day.
- Photographers and videographers are expected to be discreet and out of view.
- Bridal attendants may use the Bride's Room to store personal belongings.
- Grooms attendants may use The Upper Room to store belongings.

After the Ceremony

- Bride, Groom, and Witnesses should meet with the Pastor immediately to sign the marriage license before greeting guests.
- There is a worship service every Saturday evening at 5:30 p.m. We ask wedding participants to clear the sanctuary and Social Hall by 4:00 pm so the custodian can make final preparations for worship.
- At least one member of the wedding party should be designated to check pews, tidy rooms used, and be sure all personal belongings are picked up after the wedding.
- Rice, bird seed and confetti are not allowed. (see Expectations above)
- Candelabra and all décor needs to be removed from the sanctuary following the wedding.

*Note: We recommend you have your receiving line at the wedding reception if you expect more than 100 guests.
