"But who do you say that I am?" - Jesus to his disciples in Luke 9:20

Jesus has been traveling with his disciples for a while at this point in Luke 9. They have seen him feed over 5000 people; they have watched as he calmed a storm with just his words; they learned from his perplexing and powerful parables; they saw pain and disease vanish as Jesus healed people. They have even been terrified as Jesus called someone back from death.

Through all of this, he asks his disciples, "Who do the crowds say I am?" and they say "John the baptist, Elijah, a new prophet." And Jesus hits them with the real question: after all you have seen, "but who do <u>you</u> say that I am?" Peter quickly jumps in with his answer: "the Messiah of God!"

What would the other disciples have said? Would they have been so sure? Would they have known how to put it into words? Would they have remained silent? And now comes the question for us... Who do we say that Jesus is? The term "messiah" had a lot of cultural significance with it in those days that we no longer have. So how would we describe Jesus to his face?

Messiah, lord, brother, friend, savior, redeemer, Son of God, one person of the Trinity, our hope, Good Shepherd, the lamb of God, our peace with God, Prince of Peace, the way, the truth, the life, God made flesh, Emmanuel, King, leader, servant... on and on and on...

All are true, but all seem to fall short. This is something to wrestle with. Take some time to think it through. Jesus is asking us this question, "But who do you say that I am?" Write your answer in the margins and discuss it with friends and family. Listen to the voice of Jesus and tell him who he is to you.


A flock of Flamingos has been spotted and will be arriving in New Ulm on May 1st! The Youth Team and youth going on our trip to Camp House will be spreading cheer and raising funds by flocking yards with Flamingos. Every 3-4 days, Flamingos will be moved from yard to yard by volunteers. If you would like to choose where the flamingos go next, you can make a donation of \$30 to the Youth Fund. There will also be an opportunity to buy flamingo insurance to prevent your lawn from being flocked with a donation of \$50. If you would like the flock moved off your lawn early, you can do so by making a donation of \$20. Flamingo Forms are located by the youth board or on the Church Website.
