All Saints Sunday

“If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord’s.” *Romans 14:8*

All Saints Sunday is November 6th. This is a special day in the church year, as we remember and give thanks for all the saints from Our Savior's who have died in faith and gone to be with the Lord since last All Saints Day. It is meaningful to remember each of them on the same day, and to remember what they meant to our congregation and to their family and friends. It is also a time for us to thank God for the gift of eternal life we have been given, for that helps us live with hope in all circumstances.

As I think about All Saints Sunday, it brings to mind the many questions and comments I receive about funerals, so I want to share a few thoughts. A funeral is a time to commend the one who has died to the care of God. It is a time to comfort one another with the assurance of the power and goodness of God. And it is a time to praise God, who has destroyed death and is the source of life and salvation. Here is what is in our hymnal, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*:

“At a person’s death, the church shares the grief of those who mourn and remembers the brevity of life on earth. At the funeral we give voice to sorrow, thank God for our loved one, and entrust this companion of ours into the hands of God. Trusting in God’s promise in baptism that we are claimed by Christ forever, we rest in the sure hope of the resurrection. When the church gathers to mark the end of life, Christ crucified and risen is the witness of worship, the strength of mutual consolation, and the hope of healing.”

At a funeral we accompany the one who has died on the last part of his or her earthly journey. Yet, much of the funeral is for the living. For those who mourn someone’s death, it is important to have the opportunity to grieve, to share memories, and hear the promises of God. It is important to comfort one another in our grief. We need these things. As people of faith, we know that death is not the final word for we believe in the resurrection. Yet, we still miss our loved ones, and a funeral helps us in our grief. A funeral gives us both comfort and hope.

As part of accompanying the one who has died, in New Ulm, the funeral procession goes to the cemetery with lights on and is led by police officers. This procession reminds us that each life matters. Whether there were ten people at the funeral or hundreds, that person is a precious child of God. Think of it, people pull to the side of the road in an act of dignity and respect in this last part of the earthly journey! It is beautiful. Does the deceased need it? They don’t, but it reminds all of us who are still living that each life makes an impact in this world and is worthy of our care.

One more thing. Many people share that they want their funeral to be a celebration, no tears. I agree, a life well lived is worth celebrating. Yet the price of love, whether that is the love of a spouse, a parent, a grandparent or a friend, is that there will be grief when that person is gone. At a funeral, sharing memories and stories helps us in our grief, but those memories may bring both tears and laughter, sadness and joy. That is all part of losing someone we love. There may even be tears if we know that person had a lived a very long life and was ready to depart this world into the arms of God. A celebration of life can bring laughter and joy, but know too, that the tears that come in remembering are also part of the healing.

There is more, but for now, I'll end with my gratitude for our funeral committee, musicians, and staff who are part of our ministry to the time of a death. They bring God's comfort and hope to the bereaved. If you have questions about funerals or about planning what you would like at your funeral, please speak with me or with Pastor Dave.

Operation Christmas Child


