Christian outlook - recognizing the pain of the past, the work in the present, and the hope for the future.

Flipping through channels or scrolling through streaming services, it is easy to see that the world has its perspective. Pessimism is easy because when someone is afraid or riled up, they stay watching. Optimism is also a powerful way to connect to people, but it does often lead to a skewed or rose-tinted view that ignores necessary points. Realism gives us hope that we are being honest, but often falls right back into pessimism.

We as Christians are called to see the world with a specific point of view: having been saved from our sinfulness and brought into the mission of God. Using the lens of our faith, we can see that optimism, pessimism, and realism all fall short of how we should see the world. We need to use pessimism to see our past and our failing; we need to use realism to view for present; and God has blessed us with promises, so optimism needs to be our view for the future.

All this is a complicated way of saying, we have work to do. Our life of faith is complicated and messy, but we are in this together. When we work as the church should (hopeful, compassionate, and united), God can work incredible things through us.

May the Holy Spirit infect our lives and help us to live in the mission of God.




