When Your Heart Aches at Christmas

Last Saturday, we laid my 24 year old cousin to rest. He was the son of my closest cousin, with whom our family spends our holidays. Hunter was the same age as my children, and he was the victim of a drug overdose. Even though he was clean for over a year, back in school and doing well, the power of drugs and addiction was a trap he was drawn back into. Our family will gather together at Christmas this year, but our hearts will be aching for the smile of this young man among us.

Many of us face the season of celebration and light with heavy hearts due to loss. It can be a spouse, a grandparent, a friend or relative. It may also be the loss of a job or a health crisis that darkens what we've always known as a time of joy. In the book of Matthew, Jesus promises to be with us always, and Psalm 46 reminds us that God is our refuge and strength. God's promises like this matter, and are meant to help us through difficult times.

There are, however a few actions we can take to help us get through the difficulties of an aching heart during holiday times.

Share what is on your mind: talk to family and friends, go to a group at church or in the community, see a professional counselor, journal your thoughts. It's important not to isolate yourself, and to talk with others

Let yourself grieve and weep: Ecclesiastes 3 tells us that there is a time to mourn because to everything there is a season. Grief is painful, but is not meant to last forever. Allow your sadness to surface when it needs to.

Don't succumb to despair or negative thoughts: Philippians 4 tells us to keep our
thoughts positive. We have hope because God

created us in his image, and calls us into the light of Christ. Turn away from negativity and find the purpose God has for you in the world. God is always creating new life.

Help others in need: No matter how our heart aches, there is much to be thankful for; and many others in the world who are in need. Hunger, homelessness, sickness, loneliness, lack of education, and many difficulties like this are felt throughout the world. When we find a cause and people who need us, we are able to move though our sadness more easily

Force yourself to get out and be with people: We need to be around others, too much time alone increases our chances of becoming clinically depressed.

Create a new tradition: A new family ritual to honor the one you have lost can help. A friend's who lost her husband last year is making French silk pie with her children as it was his favorite dessert.

Ron Edmondson recommends this last one as important:

Learn to worship in tears: When we worship together often the Spirit is alive and our emotions overflow. God embraces our tears, and in fact Jesus wept at the death of friend Lazarus.

If your heart aches this year, may you know that God's purpose is for all of us know the light of Christ, even in the midst of darkness. We are created to know the warmth of God's love and the strength of God's power so we can follow Gods path for us in the world. May you be blessed this year as your heart aches, and may you allow Jesus Christ to fill the void in your life with grace and light.

They were able to see the cafeteria where meals are served, a room in which folks can get a bed for the night, and transition housing for folks who are gaining employment and looking for a permanent place to live.

Then it was time to work. For 2 hours, the group sorted through winter coats that had been donated from the Salvation Army's Thanksgiving Coat Drive. It was quite the process. Coats had to be sorted through by size, kids, adult small and medium were bagged to be sent to a different shelter; adult large and bigger were hung by gender styles so residents could come in to pick out a coat. It was a lengthy and at times overwhelming process, but in the end filled a desperate need for the shelter. The group then finished their time by decorating one of the hallways of the transitional housing floors with Christmas decorations. It was a fun yet exhausting experience.

The group then enjoyed an evening of entertainment and food. First was to take in the comedy Triple Espresso, a show that has been around for nearly 30 years. It was a perfect mixture of singing entertainment, laughter, and even a little magic! To cap off the night, the group enjoyed a meal at the Old Spaghetti Factory, an Our Savior's Favorite!

Overall it was a great trip and a wonderful opportunity for the group to spread some joy and cheer in this Christmas Season and live out the God's Work, Our Hands mission. And despite the snowy conditions on the way home...everyone made it back safe and sound!

Another way to Give!

Did you know that by donating retirement funds in your IRA to Our Saviors Lutheran Church you can avoid unnecessary income taxes? At the same time, you are helping enhance the ministries of your church.

The IRA Charitable Rollover gives individuals who are 70 ½ or older the opportunity to make "qualified charitable distributions" and not include the IRA distribution as part of their income. It can help you make direct gifts to ministry and save taxes. Congress made this Rollover permanent last year and it will satisfy all or a part of one's minimum distribution requirement. If you are in this situation, please consider a gift to Our Saviors.

On Wednesday, January 11 at 6:30 p.m., Patty Wetterling will be in Springfield to share her story about Jacob's disappearance and her family's journey these past 27 years.

While Jacob was taken in what we think of as the typical 'stranger abduction', Patty knows this kind of scenario happens in a small percentage of cases. She understands that teaching children about 'stranger danger' is counterproductive since most children are sexually abused by someone the child knows and trusts. Instead of just focusing on what she could do to find her son, Patty has tried to provide protection for all of our children. Her family's grief turned into action and they created the Jacob Wetterling Resource Center. She advocates for better laws, for better policing, for better education, for more prevention and, as she said in her community presentation in Redwood Falls this past April, "for a world that is worthy of its' children". Through her own grief, sadness, and despair she marched on. Patty never looked for honors or accolades for her work. She does it for Jacob and for children everywhere.
